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N.J., N.Y. PATH train commuters launch online survey to collect service complaints

There's a new group that has posted an online survey so people can tell the Port Authority what they think of the PATH. Named "PATHSUX" it's clear what the survey's authors think.

A group of PATH riders are so fed up with crowded trains that they have started an online survey and they plan to deliver the results to the Port Authority.

Ridership has been soaring on PATH trains, leading to massively crowded cars during rush hour. In 2008, ridership hit about 75 million in 2008, an increase of more than three million over 2007. That's the highest number since the Port Authority took over the transit system in 1962 when daily ridership averaged a little over 250,000.

The survey's authors write "We have gotten so sick of how lousy the NJ PATH service has gotten over recent years, that we had to do something about it. So some commuters have banded together and created http://www.pathsux.com/, an independent survey of NJ PATH train service. If you are as pissed off with their poor service and crowded trains as we are, please fill it out."

Then again, if you love the service you could still take the survey to make sure the results aren't too one sided.

After the first day of the survey, 80 percent have said that Newark-WTC trains are too crowded during the morning rush hour and 70 percent say

the evening rush hour is too crowded on the Newark-WTC lines. On the 33rd Street line it's even worse: 82 percent think the morning rush is too crowded and 93 percent think the evening rush is too crowded.


The Port Authority is listening to its passengers' concerns and has made a

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significant commitment to improve our PATH system by investing more than \$3 billion in new cars, track signals and modernized stations over the next decade, officials said. New PATH railcars, with state-of-the-art amenities, are already are being put into service under the plan to completely overhaul the 340-car fleet between now and 2011.

In addition, spokesman Ron Marsico said that the Port Authority is in the process of extending platforms on certain Newark-WTC stations, which will allow them to increase the number of cars on each train from seven to 10, which should significantly ease crowding on that line.
